


RONALD ANDERSON



2018 SANTA BARBARA COURT OF CHAMPIONS INDUCTEE

Ronald Gene Anderson was born October 15, 1958 in Chicago, Illinois. He played high school basketball at Bowen High School before moving onto Santa Barbara City College during the 1980-82 school years. He was offered a scholarship to Fresno State University for the years 1982-84, in which he helped lead the team to the NIT Title game under Head Coach Ron Adams.

Listed at 6'7, 215 pounds, Anderson was drafted the 27th pick of the 2nd round in the NBA by the Cleveland Cavaliers. His best years were playing alongside teammate Charles Barkley with the Philadelphia 76ers, with his best output of 16.2 PPG during the 1988-89 Campaign of his 5 years with City of Liberty.

Highlights in Ron Anderson's NBA career:

- He scored 7,056 points (10.6 PPG) during his 11 year NBA career

- 2312 total rebounds; 3.5 per game

- *At age 52, he announced his final retirement on November 16, 2010 and played his final professional game on November 27, 2010.

- *His son, Ron Jr. played for South Florida University after transferring from Kansas State in 2011.
- *His son continued his playing career in Europe, professionally.
