Joined the U.S. Navy upon his graduation from Cathedral Latin High School in 1944. He served in both the Atlantic and Pacifi c campaigns as an electrician's mate aboard the U.S.S. Zellars, a destroyer that was heavily damaged during a kamikaze attack at Okinawa which took the lives of 42 of his shipmates.

 Came to the Santa Barbara News-Press in August of 1954 as co-sports editor. He was soon elevated to sports editor and wrote his Patton's Pressbox column for 16 years.

- Covered UCSB athletics from 1954 until 1970
- Voice of the Gauchos as the fi rst radio play-by-play announcer for both the football and basketball teams from 1959 to 1970
- He was instrumental in bringing minor league baseball to Santa Barbara in 1962
- Played a role in the creation of the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table in 1968.
- He was awarded the R.F. MacFarland Memorial Trophy by the Semana Nautica Association for his service to the community in June of 1970.
- Inducted into the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Hall of Fame posthumously in May of 1972.
