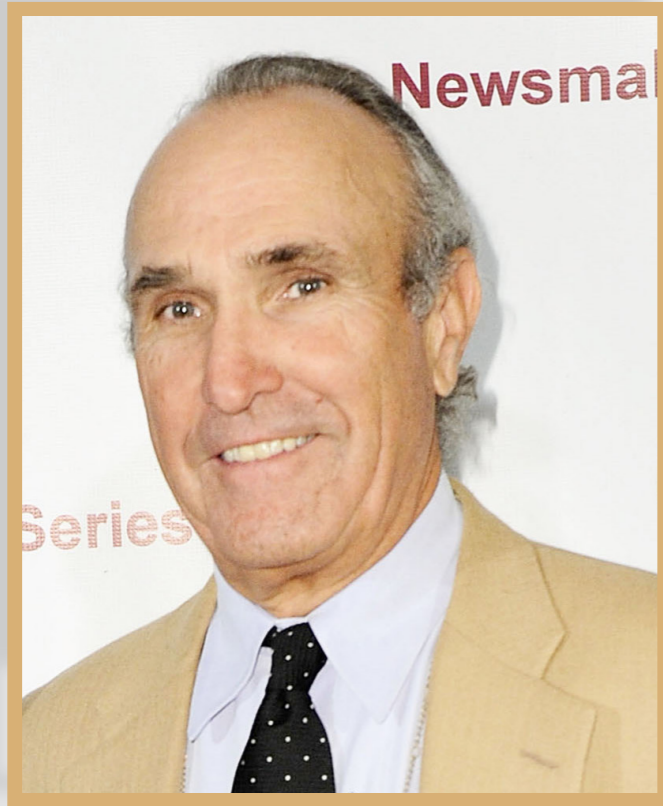

Ron Shelton (September 15, 1945 in Whittier, California) is an Oscar-nominated U.S. film director and screenwriter, best known for the many films he has made about sports.

Shelton played baseball and basketball for the SBHS Dons, and then attended Westmont College playing both sports. His father Rath, was a long time employee of Westmont College and an icon in the community of Santa Barbara,

Shelton was a minor league baseball player in the Baltimore Orioles' organization from 1967 to 1971.

Ron Shelton is a Hollywood, sports-film writer, executive producer and, director -- The sports-centric filmmaker's most notable movies include Bull Durham, Tin Cup and White Men Can't Jump, Blue Chips, Ty Cobb, and The Best of Times. Serving as executive producers alongside him on various projects are several members of the L.A. Lakers family, including assistant coach Kurt Rambis, retired coach Phil Jackson and team execs Jeanie Buss and Linda Rambis -- the latter two doing so under their shingle Street Reason Entertainment.
