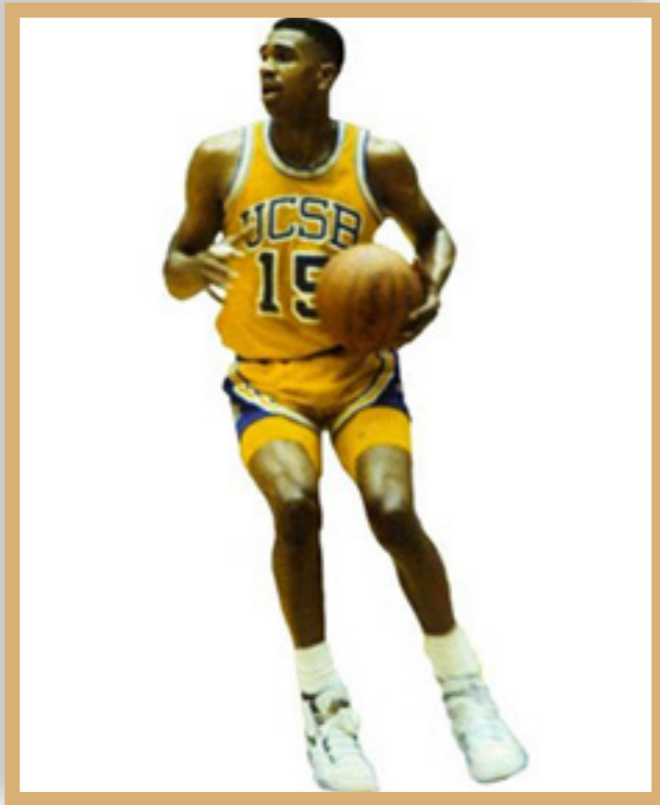

Carrick Dehart, “a legend of the ‘Dome...”

“Of all the teams you could guess that would hand UNLV their only loss in a 55-game stretch that included the 1990 national title, UCSB likely wouldn’t be at the top of the list. But the Gauchos were a more than worthy competitor thanks in large part to Carrick Dehart, who to this day remains one of the best players in school history. During DeHart’s time at UCSB the Gauchos made two NCAA Tournament appearances (beating Houston in 1990) and an NIT appearance in between..”

“Dehart, who grew up in Inglewood, CA, scored 1,687 career points, a record that stood for 18 years, still ranks second in UCSB history.”

- Played at UCSB from 1986-90
- Scored 1,687 career points, a record that stood for 18 years and still ranks second in UCSB history
- Ranks among the school’s top-10 in 10 statistical categories
- Named Big West Freshman of the Year in 1987
- A three-time All-Big West selection
- Named an All-American in 1990
- Led the 1988 and 1990 Gauchos into the NCAA Tournament
- In 1990, after helping UCSB to an NCAA first round victory over Houston, led the team with 23 points in the second round against Big 10 Champion Michigan State.
- In 1990, scored a game-high 24 points with an injured ankle against top-ranked UNLV. The Gauchos beat the eventual national champions 78-70, the Runnin’ Rebels’ only loss over a 55-game stretch.
