
My favorite Golfer is Jack Nicklaus. He not only was a great Player but a person who has paid back with his fame and fortune.

Basketball shaped my life more than almost anything else. "The Game" instilled in me strength, confidence and the persistence to achieve my Goals in life. Many of my life-long friendships were made in and around the game of Basketball. It's also provided me with a

strong work ethic "That nothing comes easy and if you want something, you have to work hard to get it". Those that know me know I am a shy person but being the team captain taught me to be a good communicator. I learned to interact with different personalities, I was responsible to be a uniter and that everyone has an opinion and deserves to be heard. Each one of us is different and that's okay! "Basketball added FUN to my life".

One of my favorite stories I love to reflect on and share are my carefree childhood days living in Carpinteria, playing basketball at my grandma and grandpa Franco's house. Jesus & Baudelia Franco and their next door neighbors: my grandma's sister Jennie Franco and my grandpa's brother Joseph Franco, and the little neighbor in the back my great grandmother my grandpa's mother Cresncia / Chencha Franco. How beautiful is that!!I was so loved and spoiled..anyways: I think before I was even born my grandpa Jess put up a basketball hoop in the perfect 2 car driveway just the perfect size of 1/2 court. For his 2 sons Robert (Budgie) Franco, and Richard (Dickey) (Boston) Franco. Little did my grandpa know that this basketball hoop was going to shape his first-born grandchild's life. So not only was it the perfect court size, it had perfect lighting that my grandpa installed that way we could play at night. I started off by playing HORSE with my cousins and my 2 uncles Uncle Budge and Uncle Ritche. I was allowed to play with the big boys once my uncles critiqued my shot.

My uncles told me if I was going to play & wanted to be good like them, "I had to stop shooting like a girl" let us show you...so lots of lessons on perfecting my shot from the free throw line,my lay-ups and my jump shot, But think about it, what was so fantastic was that my

uncles were about ten to twelve years older than me and they took the time and patience to teach me their skills & help me with my game. And on top of that, once they felt I had it down I was allowed to play with the big guys. They gave me no preferential treatment, if I wanted to play with them, I had to endure the bumps and bruises as well. It was fantastic!! So, needless to say..... all of those endless days and nights with my cousin Bobby's stereo speakers blasting out music from my poor great grandmother's windows while shooting hoops is a priceless memory.

Caudillo was a four-sport athlete at Carpinteria High School, earning varsity letters in track & field, basketball, softball and volleyball. She earned 9 varsity letters and was awarded the Henry B. Beldon sportsmanship trophy her senior year for demonstrating outstanding sportsmanlike conduct both on and off the field. She is considered a pioneer in girl's athletics at Carpinteria High School, in helping change the landscape of girls' sports from recreational to competitive.

Caudillo was a member of the first Carpinteria girls' basketball team to enter CIF competition in 1976. She earned Honorable Mention honors that season and went on to be First Team All Tri-Valley League in both 1977 and 1978. Caudillo was captain of the basketball teams both her junior and senior years and earned MVP honors in her senior year.



# Sarah Grieve Miller



Sarah Grieve Miller is from a family of basketball players: her mother Leslie Ford Grieve, uncle Don Ford, and aunt Holly Ford Emerson have all been inducted into the Court of Champions. Her parents met because her mother

was the statistician for the Santa Barbara City College men's team on which her father Scott Grieve played. Though she grew up watching basketball, she didn't play until her 8th grade year.

At Carpinteria High School Grieve Miller was a twosport athlete, lettering in both basketball and track and field (discus and shot put). On the basketball court, she is the Warriors' leading career rebounder with 1,511 rebounds and leading shot blocker with 409. She is the second all-time scorer with 1,252 points. Grieve Miller set and still holds many season and single game records. She earned Tri-Valley League honors each of her seasons: honorable mention as a freshman, first team as a sophomore, and MVP and co-MVP in her junior and senior seasons respectively. She was first team All CIF Southern Section her last two seasons. In 2000, she helped lead the Warriors to their second Tri-Valley League championship. Grieve Miller graduated the valedictorian of her high school class.

After high school, Grieve Miller played basketball at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo for five years on scholarship (red-shirting her first season). She blocked 77 shots in college, which places her as the 4th all-time for

Cal Poly. She made the Big West All-Academic Team for 3 seasons. In 2006, she was the Cal Poly Student-Athlete of the Year. She was an Academic All-American first team selection for District 8 during her senior season.

Grieve Miller earned a BA in English in 2005. She was the Cal Poly College of Liberal Arts student of the year and graduated at the top of her class. She completed her Masters in English at Cal Poly in 2007. Grieve Miller then moved across the country to continue her education, earning a Master of Fine Arts in poetry from Florida State University in 2010. She headed back west to pursue her doctorate in American literature at Arizona State University, graduating in 2015. While in Arizona, she coached basketball at Mesquite High School in Gilbert for 5 years. She was the varsity post coach and the freshman and JV coach for one year each. Many of the players she coached went on to play college basketball.

Sarah lives in San Luis Obispo, CA with her husband Adam and daughter Lucy. She is a publishing poet—her first collection of poems Winged was published by Finishing Line Press in 2017. She is a professor at Cuesta College where she teaches writing and literature.

Ann and a few of her friends, tried out for the boys team, forcing the school to create a girls team. Ann attended Carpinteria High School from 1978-82. She excelled in basketball, and played volleyball and softball. The leading career-scorer in CHS history with 1,287 points, Latham was the Tri-Valley League Co-MVP in 1981 and 1982, a first-team All-Tri-Valley League selection three years in a row (1980-82) and an All-CIF selection in 1982. She also holds the career rebounding mark with 1,037. Latham was the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Athlete of the Year in 1982.

Latham lead the Warriors to their first-ever Tri-Valley League title in volleyball in 1981 and was named League Co-MVP that year as well as an all-league selection in 1980 and 1981. She was a second-team All-Tri-Valley League selection in softball in 1982.

Latham attended Stanford University, earning a B.S. in Industrial Engineering in 1986. Although she wan't able to play basketball for Stanford, she became a standout rugby player.

She earned Norcal All-League honors four years in a row (1984-87) and played for the Pacific Coast Grizzlies from 1985-87. After college, Latham was a member of the USA Women's National Rugby Team.

Latham is proud to that her teams helped to significantly advanced the standards of girls' athletics at CHS, gaining the respect of the boys teams and representing themselves well as young women. She continued playing basketball in recreation leagues and pick up games into her 50's.

After a career in marketing for high tech startups in the Silicon Valley, Ann is now semi-retired, living in San Jose and traveling the world with her spouse Rossana Monzon.

points, two assists and a season-high seven rebounds in a 90-66 win over No. 2 Robert Morris on Dec. 29.

AS A SENIOR IN 2012-13: Started 21 of 29 games played, averaging 10.6 PPG and 4.2 RPG ... Tallied career-high 30 points on 10-of-12 shooting in NAIA Opening Round vs. MidAmerica Nazarene on Mar. 14 ... 30 points were the third-most in a single game in team history ... Had a double-double with 15 points and 10 boards vs. La Sirra on Jan. 31 ... 52 3-pointers were second-most on the squad ... Will graduate as CSUSM's career leader in scoring (732), made field goals (241), 3-point field goals made (122), made free throws (128) and rebounds (224) ... # Ryan Reed



A Carpinteria native who was active in all sports growing up. Reed spent countless hours at the Carpinteria Boys Club. He was part of league titles for Carpinteria his senior year in both basketball and tennis.

Ryan has the distinguished honor of being inducted alongside two of his high school coaches - Butch Breeden and Henry Gonzalez, his Boys Club mentor Rich Medel, and also alongside a player he coached at Carpinteria High School, Jacob Ranger.

Not a standout on his high school basketball team, not even a starter, but Ryan always gave 100% on the court. After graduating high school, not wanting the joy of sports to end, he committed himself to extensive workouts and long hours alone on the court, to prepare himself for a chance to walk-on his college basketball team. He made the team! His insatiable work ethic continued and helped him make an immediate impact on his college team. From walk-on to starter, from starter to team captain for Life Bible College (now Life Pacific University), Reed had a stellar career. He even held a short-lived record for highest free-throw percentage in the nation.

Ryan loved playing basketball, but what he really wanted to do was coach. Like his mentors before him; Gonzales, Breeden, and Medel, he wanted to impact the lives of the youth of his community.

He coached his first high school basketball team while still playing in college. Upon returning home to Carpinteria in 2004, he immediately signed up to assist the new Varsity head coach John Ward Sr., who

had coached at rival Bishop Diego while Reed played for Carpitneria. He learned so much that year under Coach Ward, and was able to coach Carpinteria standout Jacob Ranger among other great players.

This is where Ryan's story really begins. Ryan Reed decided the youth of Carpinteria, particularly the at-risk youth, needed more to keep them busy, more to help develop character, more to teach them that with hard work and determination they could make anything of their life. So with the help of friends and other coaches, Ryan began the Mavericks basketball program in Carpinteria.

Now in its 15th year, literally hundreds upon hundreds of kids have participated in travel basketball, summer camps, summer leagues and elite camps. From 2nd grade through High school, boys and girls, Mavericks has deeply impacted the Carpinteria community.

The "Mavericks Family" is a place where young men are encouraged to be "Dads that stay", and girls are encouraged toward the deeper beauty of character. Where gang families are replaced with on-court family, and academic frustration is traded for hope and collegiate aspirations.

Hundreds of kids have been served through the Mavericks basketball travel program, Mavericks summer camps, Mavericks Character awards, and the Mavericks scholarship fund. Their motto comes from Romans 5 in the Bible, "We welcome Testing, Testing produces Perseverance, Perseverance builds Character, Character gives Hope."

Matt graduated in 1979 from Carpinteria High School

A 1984 UC Santa Barbara graduate, Matt earned his Master's Degree in Educational Administration from CSU Long Beach in 1989.

He got his start coaching for Frank Carbajal at SBCC and coached eight years at Long Beach State working with coaches such as Seth Greenberg, Derrick Whittenburg, Joe Harrington, Butch Carter, Bobby Braswell, and Glenn McDonald

He stepped down six years ago as the head coach of the Lakewood Boys' Basketball Program after 20 years in that position.

In his 34 year coaching career, he has coached at every major level including junior college, Division I men's and women's basketball, and high school.


Matt resigned in June, 2014 as the Boys' Athletic Director at Lakewood, having served in that position for 16 years while overseeing 11 varsity sports.
