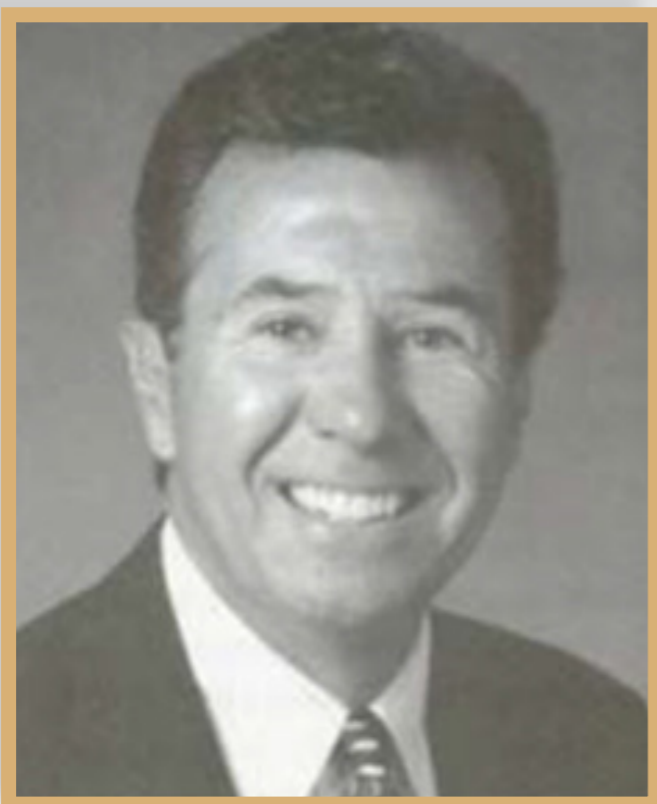




# SANTA BARBARA COURT OF CHAMPIONS

- Overall coaching record: 395-288
- Pimm guided the University of Utah basketball team for nine seasons as its head coach (1974-83). He took over the head coaching position after 13 years as an assistant coach.
- Utah advanced to five NCAA Tournaments and one Sweet 16 during Pimm's tenure at the school. The Utes won 20 or more games four times, including an all-time high of 25 in 1980-81.
- Sent many players to the NBA including Michael Chambers, Pace Mannion, Danny Vranes, Luther Burden, Jeff Judkins, Mike Newlin, Merv Jackson, Kenny Gardner, Jerry Chambers, Dewitt Menyard, and Mike Sojourner.
- Three-time NCAA District 7 Coach of the Year at Utah.
- Performed an amazing turnaround with the UC Santa Barbara basketball program (1983-98).
- In 1986-87, he guided UCSB to its first winning record in 11 seasons, going 16-13 and finishing second in the Big West Conference.
- In 1987-88, the Gauchos won 22 games and advanced to their first NCAA Tournament.
- In 15 seasons in Santa Barbara, Pimm's teams won 223 games, a school record for a head coach, and they made five postseason appearances, including two NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Coached NBA Head Coach Brian Shaw.
- Two-time Big West Coach of the Year and a one-time NCAA District 8 Coach of the Year.
- Served as a consultant and assistant coach with the United States National team for 15 years (1973-88). He helped select the U.S. teams for the 1976, 1980, 1984, and 1988 Summer Olympics.
- In 1986, he was the top assistant coach for the U.S. National Team that won the Gold Medal at the FIBA World Championships in Spain. That team included former Gaucho Brian Shaw.
- As a player, Pimm was selected NCAA All-West Region following his junior and senior seasons at the University of Southern California (USC). As a freshman, he was an All-American at Fullerton Community College. As a senior at Montebello High School, Pimm led the nation in scoring at 29.6 points per game.
